Mr. Freeman:

I wanted to emphasize what a good idea it would be to purchase the land from CalCot and make that the site of the Bakersfield Homeless center.

The CalCot site is almost turn-key, move-in ready for such a shelter. There are existing offices which could serve as the offices for the support services such as mental health, job counseling, etc. There is ample parking for all personnel as well as the shuttle buses that would transport the homeless. There are break rooms and kitchens as well as room for a larger commercial kitchen for food preparation. There is an air conditioned storage unit for the private property of the homeless residents.

There is room for an east-side Police substation, which is badly needed and will only be more needed as our city grows. There is room for expansion of the existing corporation yard and if necessary, an option to purchase the adjacent 10 acres for that purpose.

It is not imperative that the facility have 450 beds to start but it would be wise to a site that would allow for such expansion. I don't think it will take long for the site to become a 450 bed site.

It would not be wise to partner with the County on a smaller site to start as I believe it would cost more in the long run to open multiple locations or move an already established location as needs become greater.

Please take the leap of faith and spend the already allocated money on a facility that allows for growth and offers all support services in one convenient location.

Bruce –

I am writing this not only as a constituent but also as President of The Board of Bakersfield Recovery Services (www.bakersfieldrecoveryservices.com). In both roles, I have a deep concern about the problem of homelessness in our city. As Board President, I believe that a partial solution is within our grasp.

As I understand it, many of the objections to the acquisition of the Calcot facility were from residents of the area who feel that they are already burdened with a disproportionate amount of poverty, blight, and crime. They could see nothing in the proposal that would improve that situation and to the contrary, perhaps could make their situation worse. As the proposal stood, I agree with them.

These facts notwithstanding, I think that with some conscientious changes, the Calcot site could fill a dual role of addressing the homeless situation *and* adding a community asset to SE Bakersfield.

Facts:

- SE residents are justly concerned about an increase in vagrancy, drug use, etc.
- The existing proposal does not include any offering of food for the newly relocated homeless residents
- Nothing in the proposal provides any solutions – only a relocation of the problem(s)
- It is likely that over 50% of our homeless population has a drug and/or alcohol addiction
- Employability is nearly zero since most this population has no address, horrible health conditions, little or no suitable clothing for any type of job and numerous other challenges

Bakersfield Recovery Services is in a position to alleviate many of the concerns of our SE residents, provide a new asset to that community, while simultaneously providing many solutions for the homeless.

We believe that a drug and/or alcohol problem cannot be addressed in a vacuum. Real impediments do exist on a path to sobriety and an eventual honorable place in society. Homelessness, malnutrition, depression, rejection, and enabling are all part of a barrier that our homeless population wakes up to every morning.

Both Jason's Retreat and Capistrano for Women are showcases for treatment that could be cloned. They demonstrate that a provision of all forms of nourishment: food, shelter, a viable path to sobriety, clothing, job counseling... can result in a return to productivity – or in some cases a first-time venture into productivity.

Bakersfield Recovery Services is prepared to discuss the implementation of any, or all, of our services at a "Calcot Campus." We could most likely offer anything ranging from on-site residential services leading to sober-living facilities and mainstreaming back into "life as it should be." We could offer out-patient services as we currently do at our downtown facility which serves over 100 clients. Out-patient services could be the key to acceptance by the SE community by offering those services to the SE residents. We could provide three meals per day for the previously-homeless residents, thus relieving local concern about increased vagrancy.

Obviously, I feel that it would be to the benefit of this city for us to seize an opportunity to discuss both the problem and a prospective solution. When you have the opportunity, please contact me and we can find a mutually convenient time to visit.

(To avoid a possible conflict with The Brown Act, I have not shared any of this with any of your fellow councilmembers. At a later date I would be happy to discuss this with other councilmembers and/or staff.)

Dear Mayor Goh:

I recently attended the Jan. 7th public meeting (Potato Room) regarding the proposed new homeless shelter sites. The meeting was well attended and staff did a great job explaining the proposed project and the multiple sites being considered. Last weekend I visited the four sites: 1900 E. Brundage Ave. (Calcot site), 601 Brown St., Weill Park, and the County site between O and M streets.

Based on the site parameters and the overwhelming need for emergency housing for the homeless, I believe the Calcot site by far is the best site for the following reasons:

1. M-2 site that has a sufficient buffer from sensitive land uses like residential and schools.
2. A 7.5 acre developed site that can easily accommodate 150 ± beds and supportive services.
3. An additional 10 acre adjacent site for a BPD sub-station, affordable housing, and/or retail.
4. Unlike the County site, the Calcot site is not in conflict with any state bullet train alignment.

Therefore, I wholeheartedly encourage the City Council to vote in favor of the Calcot site for the new low barrier homeless facility.


The is letter is in support of the Calcot Homeless Shelter plan as the preferred option for a much needed Bakersfield City low barrier homeless shelter.

To whom this may concern:

Excel Business Park LLC (Rexco) is the owner of adjacent industrial buildings located directly south of the proposed homeless shelter that would be located at 1900 E. Brundage Lane. This letter will serve as notice that we are opposed to the use of the adjacent property as a shelter for the homeless. The justification for our opposition is the current amount of problems we are experiencing with vandalism, theft, loitering, and safety issues with the homeless population in the area. Additionally, we have been contacted by our current tenants with their concern with this proposal. They expressed they would not be interested in staying at their current location if this were to be approved. An example of some of the issues that have occurred recently include: stolen copper plumbing, stolen backflow devices, cutting and removal of barrier fencing at drainage ponds, vehicles being broken into, theft of raw materials from storage yards.

There have been countless incidents with tenants arriving to work to find homeless sleeping or loitering in front of the building entrances. This has created a very unsafe work environment for our tenants. The size and location of this proposed homeless facility would exasperate the unsafe work environment which would lead to a tremendous loss of jobs and business in the area.

We understand the growing need to take care and house the homeless, however, due to the reasons listed above we do not believe that a facility this large at this location would be in the best interest for the city of Bakersfield.

To Councilman Gonzales and Councilman Rivera, and to all the members of the Bakersfield City Council and Mayor Goh.

I want to write you concerning your proposal to put a 450 plus bed homeless shelter in East Bakersfield. I have heard from an inside source that you may also combine the other eastside shelter with this one, and make it bigger.

It is totally not acceptable to put all this burden on one sector of our city. This in my opinion is an act of social injustice. I have been told that in many cities they disburse these shelters into several different areas of a city so one area is not overwhelmed.

I want it to be clear that VBF is supportive of a smaller 125 bed shelter in this part of the city if needed. We have been an advocate of the poor for almost 45 years in our city and will continue to be. Our reputation speaks for itself. But you can't expect one section of the city to bear the burden of the whole city.

What bothers me most is the city's total disrespect for the black community where many reside just off Cottonwood Road, as well as the poor predominantly hispanic and latino community in the surrounding neighborhoods. You are showing no sympathy for them or us at all. You didn't even have the courtesy to sit down with us and talk about the project before proceeding with your plans. We are one of the largest churches in the city with a private day care center and elementary school. We have been voted the "favorite" or "best place to worship" for more than the past decade.

We are also concerned about the fact that it is possible that we will lose our school and possibly everything else we have labored for in the past almost 50 years. You put yourself in our shoes.

I would love to know how many of you live within one mile of a huge homeless shelter. Am I safe to assume that none of you do?

Am I safe to assume that all of you would be protesting if this was happening to you? This facility is approximately 1/2 mile from VBF and our elementary school, and 1/2 mile from Cottonwood Road.

Our property values are going to plummet with a facility of this size. The black community, the hispanics and others have worked hard to have a home and place to raise their children, and now you are going to take away what little equity they have in their homes. Our children are not going to be safe in their own backyard. Among the homeless are child molesters, drug addicts, alcoholics, and people with serious mental issues. None of us will be safe in our own neighborhoods.

I think it's safe to say that many if not most of the homeless population are not mere people down on their luck, but could be described as people with the problems mentioned above.

I would request that the city officials take this to heart. We would so much appreciate your reconsideration of moving forward with a facility this size in our neighborhood.

If I don't get feedback I will be distributing this message to thousands of homes via flyers by tomorrow afternoon. I am also prepared to go to social media with all of this information.

Councilman Rivera, you were elected to look out for our best interests.

Councilman Gonzales, I know you have a problem downtown but this is not the way to solve it.

Thank you for your consideration, and I will await to hear from you before I go public!

Honorable Council Members,

As you prepare to make a decision on Wednesday about using City funds to add emergency shelter capacity in Bakersfield, I hope you will consider the following information:

1. **This is a long term problem that needs a long term solution.** The significant increase in homelessness in Bakersfield, Kern County, and California is not a short term issue that is likely to go away in a few years because the underlying issues contributing to the increase in the number of persons becoming homeless (lack of affordable housing, criminal justice reform, etc.) will not be solved in a few years. In addition, at some point we will face an economic downturn that will only exacerbate the problem. *City funds should be invested in a location that provides a long-term solution, not a temporary fix.*
2. **To address the public's concern with the visibility of homeless persons, more Emergency Shelter beds are needed.** A recent gaps analysis determined that even with the addition of the 150 County beds, the 40 bed expansion at BHC, the 40 bed expansion at The Mission, and 150 beds at a City funded site, there will only be enough shelter capacity to house 75% of persons experiencing homelessness in the greater Bakersfield area. This is based on the January 2019 Point in Time count, and most observers believe the count will be higher when completed next Friday. *City funds should be invested in a location that provides the opportunity for expansion.*
3. **Delaying has real consequences.** Persons experiencing homelessness are literally dying on our streets and the public is becoming weary of what appears to be a lack of progress on the issue. Further delay will not help and will contribute to a perception that their support of Measure N was a mistake. While shelters are only part of the solution, they are a critical first step and important component of the continuum of care as we work together to address homelessness in our community. *City staff should be given clear direction on Wednesday to move forward with a location that provides a significant expansion in shelter capacity, provides robust onsite services, and provides the opportunity for long term expansion as needed.*

Thank you for considering this information as I know you have a difficult decision to make next week. In addition, the Housing Authority and its affiliated non-profits look forward to continuing to partner with the City to provide innovative and effective solutions to address homelessness in Bakersfield. **We will begin construction this year on four developments with a total of 175 affordable housing units in the Bakersfield area, each with units set aside for persons experiencing homelessness.** In addition, we have submitted funding applications for another four developments totaling 145 new affordable units in Bakersfield that if funded could begin construction in 2021. The City is a funding partner or potential partner on several of the developments and these new units will help provide permanent solutions so persons experiencing homelessness can exit the shelters. We appreciate your partnership.

As you know, achieving a solution to the homelessness problem was a primary driver of the recent initiative to provide the City with additional funding. I support the efforts of the city to invest in solutions to combat this growing problem.

The City was given the funding to be a responsible partner with the County of Kern, and the District Attorney & Sheriff in solving this problem. I was very disappointing when the city failed to act on a low-barrier shelter, a critical component in the local strategy to address homelessness.
