Re: Ensuring Adequate Time for Public Comment at Upcoming City Council Meeting

Dear Councilmembers:

On behalf of the ACLU of Southern California and Bakersfield constituents, we write to raise concern with the allotment of time for public comment during the upcoming regular meeting of the City Council, on Wednesday June 16, particularly in relation to Item # 12(a), a resolution to adopt the City's proposed Fiscal Year 2021-22 budget, totaling approximately \$683.2 million. The proposed budget for the Bakersfield Police Department is approximately \$133.6 million—representing an 11.16% year-over-year increase and comprising approximately \$2% of the City's general fund appropriations. It would enable, for example, the addition of 28 new sworn officers and 17 new civilian police positions, comprising more than 50% of all new positions, which continues a multiyear trend of expanding BPD. We ask that the Council provide enough time for all who are present to offer their comments on this agenda item at Wednesday's meeting.

Budget allocations are some of the most consequential decisions the City Council makes. As the California Supreme Court has observed, "[i]t is difficult to imagine a more critical time for public scrutiny of its governmental decision-making process than when the latter is determining how it shall spend public funds." *IFPTE, Local 21 v. Superior Court,* 42 Cal. 4th 319, 334 (2007) (citation omitted). It is incumbent upon the City Council to enable, as much as reasonably possible, the right of speakers to "directly address the legislative body on any item of interest to the public, before or during the legislative body's consideration of the item," Gov. Code § 54954.3(a), and to uphold the California Constitution's guarantees of the "right to instruct their representatives" as to how they think they should exercise their authority, as well as the right to require "an opportunity for public comment on each specific agenda item **as it is taken up by the body**." *Galbiso v. Orosi Pub. Util. Dist.*, 167 Cal. App. 4th 1063, 1079 (2008) (emphasis added).

A large increase in BPD's budget justifies—and is likely to draw—focused public scrutiny. Indeed, the ACLU of Southern California and other community-led organizations have raised

concerns over BPD "proactive" patrol policies that lead to racially discriminatory and disproportionate stops under the guise of traffic and enforcement of other code violations such as jaywalking and drinking alcohol on the street. Moreover, nearly half of all BPD use-of-force incidents arise from pursuing low-level misdemeanor crimes or alleged nuisance behavior, or from officers responding to behavioral health crises, and data show that excessive use of force disproportionately lands upon Latine and Black individuals and people with disabilities. Bakersfield constituents should be given ample time to question and express concerns regarding the proposal to substantially increase BPD's budget in light of its track record.

The Council should also anticipate substantial public interest based on the recent history of community interest in this issue. During the June 24, 2020 budget hearing, there were 22 public comments on the budget, leading to an extension in the time available to comment on the topic from 15 minutes to 30 and ultimately even more time. In recent meetings, however, including the May 5, 2021 budget presentation meeting, such extensions have been denied when there have been more speaker cards than the allotted 15 minutes of time allowed. As a result, community members who were present to address the Council were not able to have their voices heard regarding the budget.¹ For an issue as critically important as the budget, that is unacceptable.

For these reasons, we ask that the City Council provide enough time for all who are present to offer their comments on the City's Fiscal Year 2021-22 budget at Wednesday's meeting. Furthermore, we ask that you publicly affirm this commitment as far in advance of the meeting as possible. Thank you for your consideration.

¹ Moreover, the Council's publicly posted agendas do not include any information regarding this time limit, which would at least allow the community to be prepared and informed before arriving in person at Council meetings. After submitting a comment card, a community member has no knowledge of whether their name will be called for public comment. Additionally, if community members are not prepared with a written public comment statement to submit in case they are not being called to speak, then they do not have the opportunity to be heard at all; the posted agenda also fail to address this issue.


