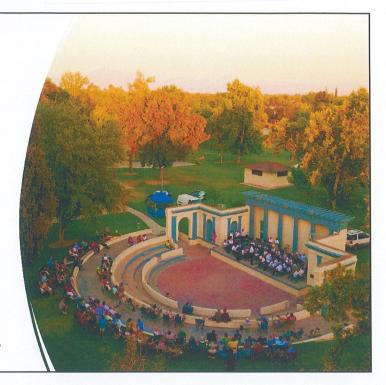

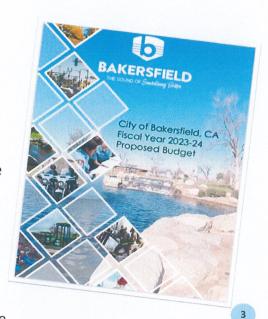

- Capital projects focus on local parks projects, affordable housing, street repairs, facility improvements, and key City-owned infrastructure



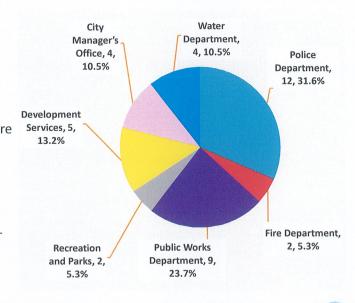
