

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council receive and file the Downtown Master Sewer Study.

#### BACKGROUND:

The Downtown Bakersfield area contains some of the oldest sewer infrastructure in the City. In order to identify available capacity of the existing sewer system and needed improvements to facilitate future development and revitalization in the Downtown area, City Council requested the commission of a Downtown Master Sewer Study. This Downtown Master Sewer Study is a key component of the City Council Goals for addressing infrastructure needs within the downtown area. The aim of the study was to develop a list of future Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Projects that will help meet the goals of the Downtown Area Vision Plan. The Downtown Master Sewer Study has recently been completed by Michael K. Nunley & Associates, Inc. (MKN & Associates).

On June 28, 2019, City Council approved a Design Consultant Agreement with MKN & Associates to prepare the Downtown Master Sewer Study, which provides a comprehensive investigation and analysis for the Downtown area's sewer system. Over the past 18 months, MKN & Associates collected as-built and mapping information, conducted in-field investigations of sewer infrastructure, and analyzed electronic models of the existing Downtown Bakersfield sewer system, as well as projected the future use of the sewer system. The final Downtown Master Sewer Study has been delivered to the City and has been accepted by Public Works Department.

At the request of City Council, MKN & Associates has developed a presentation of the Downtown Master Sewer Study which aims to provide insight on how MKN & Associates prepared and analyzed the sewer infrastructure for the Downtown area and developed their list of CIP projects. Additionally, they will discuss prioritization of the recommended CIP projects and provide information on how those projects will deliver a high level of service and meet the goals of the Downtown Area Vision Plan.






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## **FIELD INVESTIGATION**

## **Field Investigation – Physical Survey**

- Focused on system 10-inch and larger
- GPS survey of 523 SSMHs (39% of system)
- Acquired and documented location, depth, rim and invert elevations, and photographs
- Gathered information key for GIS update and hydraulic model






## **Field Investigation – Flow Monitoring**

- Six (6) flow meters
- 4 weeks (flow and depth)
- Locations: Major trunks





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## SEWER SYSTEM MODELING

## **Development of Model**


- Built enhanced database (>=10-inch)
- Calibrated based on Flow Monitoring
- Developed Sewage Generation Rates
  - SFR, MFR, Commercial, etc.
  - Based on return flow from consumption



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### **Hydraulic Analysis**

- Evaluated <u>Downtown Vision Plan</u>
  - Phase 1 10 years (25%)
  - Phase 2 20 years (20%)
  - Phase 2 30 years (15%)
- Evaluated Existing and Future Flows
  - Dry weather only
  - Planned CIPs / CIP scenarios
- Identified Capacity Constraints





## DOWNTOWN MASTER SEWER STUDY

### **Manhole Inspections**

- Inspected 50 SSMHs
- Completed condition assessment logs
- Captured location, orientation, diameter, inlets/outlets, coatings, bench, flow, structural distress
- Captured video of interior and lid/cone
- Performed scratch/penetration testing
- Integrated results into GIS





### **Lift Station Inspections**

- Site inspection at four (4) lift stations
  - 19th St.
  - Mill Creek
  - Bank
  - Convention Center
- Identified and documented operational, access, corrosion, structural, and safety issues
- Gathered information for hydraulic evaluation



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### **Condition Assessment – Physical and Hydraulic Improvements**


- Summarized field inspection records
- Reviewed and categorized deficiencies (e.g., structural or O&M)
- Developed and applied PACP (NASSCO) type rating system
- Rankings sorted by severity
- Recommended Improvements (CIPs)
  - Resolve existing deficiencies
  - Address near-term (2025)
  - Address future needs (2050)
