- Alternatively, you may comment by calling (661) 326-3100 and leaving a voicemail of no more than 3 minutes no later than 4:00 p.m. the Tuesday prior to the Council meeting. Your message must clearly indicate whether your comment relates to a particular agenda item, or is a general public comment. If your comment meets the foregoing criteria, it will be transcribed as accurately as possible.
- If you are watching the live stream of the meeting and wish to make a comment on a specific agenda item as it is being heard, please email your written comment to the City Clerk at City\_Clerk@bakersfieldcity.us. All comments received during the meeting may not be read, but will be included as part of the permanent public record of the meeting.







#### **Our Vision**


Homelessness is a rare, brief and nonrecurring experience.

#### System Performance Measures (SPMs)

System Performance Measures help evaluate progress towards our vision.

Goal	Metric	Definition
Rare	Inflow	# of individuals experiencing homelessness for the first time.
	Outflow	# of individuals experiencing homelessness who achieve permanent housing
Brief	Length of Time (LOT) Homeless	Average # of nights an individual stays in an Emergency Shelter or Temporary Housing before achieving permanent housing. Does not account for nights living unsheltered.
Nonrecurring	Recidivism Rate	% of persons that return to experiencing homelessness within 2 years of achieving permanent housing

### **Inflow and Outflow**




Inflow: # of individuals experiencing homelessness for the first time Outflow: # of individuals experiencing homelessness who achieve permanent housing

## Length of Time (LOT) Homeless

### 2-1-1: Coordinated Entry System (CES)

What is the Coordinated Entry System (CES)? A single point-of-contact for the Continuum of Care.


CES assesses and refers individuals to resources to help them maintain or achieve permanent housing.

#### Who manages CES?

Community Action Partnership of Kern (CAPK)

CES is a referral source for the Brundage Lane Navigation Center


### 2-1-1 Intake Calls, 2019 vs 2020



### COVID-19 Rent and Mortgage Assistance Programs

Provided grants paid directly to landlords or lenders for individuals and families impacted by COVID-19

- Maximum payment of \$10,000
- Household income up to 120%
  of Area Median Income (AMI)



### Local COVID-19 RMA programs served 1,529 households



### Unsheltered Population

- Among the most difficult to place in permanent housing
- Anecdotally, higher instances of severe behavioral health conditions
- Anecdotally, higher instances of substance use disorder
- Other conditions that require ongoing support
- Source of many resident and stakeholder nuisance complaints

790 Unsheltered people that qualify for Permanent Supportive Housing

- Analyze HMIS data on unsheltered clients.
- · Conduct an inventory of PSH units in Bakersfield/Kern County region

- Expand case management and street outreach
- Establish a 5-year target for PSH development in the City of Bakersfield
