#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of the final video cut of the 2021 Youth Commission PSA project.

#### BACKGROUND:

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic the Youth Commission suspended in-person meetings while local, state, and federal agencies determined safe meeting protocols, during which time the Youth Commission was unable to complete a project for FY 2019-2020. After several months of the Youth Commission being unable to meet, monthly Youth Commission meetings resumed via Zoom. Beginning March 2021, the Youth Commission resumed meeting in-person at City Hall North.

Each fiscal year, the City of Bakersfield Youth Commission is tasked with developing a project to to engage and empower local youth on relevant issues pertaining to municipal policies, programs, and projects. For the last 18 months, the Youth Commission has been working toward developing a new project.
