BACKGROUND:

At the November 7, 2022 special Youth Commission meeting, the last of four presentations regarding the annual project was delivered. The potential project entailed a collaboration with the Apple Core Project Inc. to include a donation drive to collect hygiene items, snacks, and school supplies to support families and teens living in local motels.

At the conclusion of the presentation, the Youth Commission took a vote to determine the project to be completed by June 30, 2022. The Youth Commission determined that the collaboration with the Apple Core Project Inc would be the one they would engage in through the rest of the fiscal year. The Youth Commission also discussed the possibility of accepting a second, smaller project depending on time constraints and availability of both Youth Commissioners and staff.
